We're all familiar with the name, Self-Help Enterprises,



but many of us don't have a solid idea about the work they do and the crucial humanitarian role they play in our community. Started locally by Quakers, their local low-cost housing model has been replicated nationwide. Their very first project was in Goshen. (They do work in other areas, such as clean-water access, but we will be focusing on housing at this meeting.) We're fortunate to have two members of C&CC with connections to Self-Help: Susan Kreps is chair of their Board of Directors, and Carol Glass was their controller for 22 years.

Susan has arranged for us to get an up-close look at how this project assists low-income families toward the American Dream. In fact, we'll be meeting at the site of their latest effort: Highland Gardens, a 36-unit apartment building that opened just in time for families to move in before Thanksgiving 2016. We are fortunate that Self-Help's CEO, Tom Collishaw, will be explaining it all to us. This is an exciting opportunity. Hope to see you there!
