Respect: A Musical Journey of Women

Here's an exciting way to escape January gloom. AAUW has reserved a block of tickets for the Visalia Community Players' January 26 matinee production of Respect: A Musical Journey of Women. AAUW's own Susan Mathews and Karen Simpson are currently rehearsing this delightful, high-energy show depicting the evolution of woman's empowerment from the early 1900's to the present day through popular music. The playwright, Dorothy Marcic, researched women's history as seen in Top 40 songs for her doctoral dissertation then morphed her book into an engaging musical celebration of they journey from as codependence of "Someone to Watch over

Me" to the independence of "I Will Survive" and beyond, including such popular pieces as "Girls Just Wanna Have Fun," "Bill Bailey," "Diamonds Are a Girl's Best Friend," "These Boots are Made for Walking", and, of course, the title song "Respect." Peppered with tales of real women, this promises to be a fun-filled and nostalgic mix of song and story. Directed by Leeni Mitchell, *Respect* also stars Marla Alberstein, Samantha Muse DuToil, Jenny Ponce, and Ronnette Torrence.

Our branch is busy and active. Stay plugged in.


