#### **Great Decisions**

"In a democracy the Government functions with the consent of the whole people. The latter must be guided by the facts. The Foreign Policy Association is performing a high duty in facilitating the lucid presentation of the facts of world problems and their impact upon the United States." — Franklin D. Roosevelt

Born from the ashes of World War I, the non-profit Foreign Policy Assn. will celebrate its centennial this coming year. In the wake of WWII, they established Great Decisions across the country, in order to engage the grass roots in better understanding international issues.

Our Branch hosts (recently in partnership with C.O.S., which provides the venue) this lively and insightful foreign policy discussion program in Visalia—open to the public as well as members. A.A.U.W. has done this for decades, but interest nearly doubled this past spring.

Participation involves eight sessions—each on a distinct, current topic—over a 3- or 4-month period, beginning in late January. Meetings are typically Tuesday evenings, and last two hours. Briefing books are required, for excellent background reading prior to each session. A limited number of these books will be available at a discount, if ordered ahead. Look for details in the October newsletter.

#### Coffee & California Concerns

A half-dozen years ago, Donna Denham and Carol Seastrom thought there might be interest among our membership in a discussion group for local and state-level policy issues...and, boy, were they right!

We meet once or twice a month, usually Monday mornings, and take on a different issue each time—sometimes bringing in outside speakers, and sometimes taking advantage of expertise within our own membership. Meetings are informal, and usually at members' homes—although we have been known to do an excursion to a relevant venue, too.



Last year's topics included studying all the ballot propositions, mental health options in our area, Lindsay Mann explaining the Kaweah-Delta Health Care District, a chief investigator at the D.A.'s office on human trafficking, a civil discourse workshop by the San Luis Obispo League of Women Voters, prejudice awareness training by the V.U.S.D. Board president, a crash course of "Crime and Punishment" by attorney Michal Cross, and an excursion to Self-Help's newest housing project. It's all fascinating!
