A Memory of the Good Old Days in the Visalia-Sequoia AAUW Branch

I thank my parents for making it possible for me to go to college, graduate and be able to join the American Association of University Women. I am so proud and grateful to AAUW for all it has given me for over 60 years.

I was a newlywed in 1949 when my husband, Mearle, and I moved from Salt Lake City, Utah, to Tulare, California, where Mearle was offered a job to learn the restaurant business at Nielsen's Creamery and Restaurant.

Leaving Salt Lake and my family and friends to make a home in Tulare was daunting, but fortunately for me, AAUW was there for me. I was welcomed, had instant friends, associations with wonderful women and choices of various interest groups.

After living 12 years in Tulare, Mearle, I, and our three daughters, Rosalie, Shelley and Amy, moved to Visalia, where we bought the restaurant at 604 S. Mooney Boulevard which became Mearle's Drive-In.

I transferred my membership in AAUW to Visalia-Sequoia Branch. There I was welcomed again, had instant friends, associations with wonderful women and choices of various interest groups.

I learned that in Visalia, the general meetings were held in the AAUW Clubhouse. I thought how special that Sequoia Branch owned its own clubhouse and making it more special, it had a beautiful baby grand piano in the meeting room. The piano was always adorned with a lovely bouquet of flowers the day of our meetings. I always admired the piano and thought it gave our meeting music, pleasure and elegance.

The clubhouse was such a source of pride for members of Visalia-Sequoia Branch through the years, but the time came when the clubhouse had to be put up for sale. Everything in the clubhouse had to be sold, including the baby grand piano.

I learned the asking price for the piano and

though it was very nominal, so I told my daughter, Rosalie who was a newlywed. Rosalie and her husband looked at the piano, liked the piano and bought it.

The years had taken a toll on the piano. It needed refurbishing in every way. Rosalie had professionals install new workings and she took on the job of refinishing it herself.

It was a long process to bring the piano back to its original beauty, but Rosalie accomplished this and since 1975 the piano has become an elegant focal point in her living room in Sacramento.

A little piece of the history of Visalia-Sequoia Branch of the American Association of University Women is still giving music, pleasure and elegance to Rosalie and her family.
