

Garden Gals Fall Fresno Chaffee Zoo Trip

It was a beautiful day and the animals were out and about in the African Savannah. We watched as the lions followed their keeper's whistle and hand signal instructions to put their paws up on the fence, walk past them, roll onto their backs, and open their mouths to allow the keepers to evaluate their health. Later some of use watched as a trainer for the sea lions checked on Whiskers' flippers, tail, belly, neck, and the interior of his mouth for his daily checkup. An interesting thing about Whiskers is that he was born blind, and the keepers use a form of hands on sign language, using their hand on his back and patterns of finger placement to tell the seal what move they want him to do next. It was quite amazing!

The African Adventures area was planned as an example of the terrain and plants of the African plains. It provides for a more realistic habitat for the animals and provides us with an idea of what the savanna looks like. The plant diversity is a result of the evolutionary processes brought about by many factors including the weather, and low soil fertility. Many plants, and animals, in other areas of the world develop similar characteristics due to convergent evolution.

Adaptations include having thick leaves, waxy surfaces, thin or small leaves, reduced transpiration, spines, methods of surviving fire and drought conditions, dropping leaves to conserve moisture, toxins, and adaptations reducing the likelihood being eaten by herbivores and omnivores. Many also store water in their trunks and provide water for animals during the long dry season.

The savanna also has many plants that are very well adapted to our Mediterranean climate. Plants we see in our area nurseries are very similar to, or are natives of the African Plains.

Most are successful in our climate. The large trees that have grown for years and still doing well in

the park are well adapted to our climate. Some irrigation is used though out the park and



zoo to help plants survive.
