Our primary fundraiser is, of course, the semiannual book sale. It is hard to imagine the number of books donated on a weekly basis. Tennis shoes, comfortable warm clothes and gloves are recommended at this time of year. Sorting takes place in a former packinghouse at Sequoia Packing off Pine Street in Exeter.

The funds from the book sale are used primarily for scholarships for COS graduates pursuing a four-year degree. A revolving committee of three members selects the scholarship recipients. One
