Notes from the Presidents: Marilyn Rankin & Liz Kieske

AAUW began the New Year with a fun and informative program celebrating the 100th year anniversary of the ratification of the 19th amendment which gave women the right to vote. The meeting was co-sponsored with the League of Women Voters and our own Maile Melkonian was instrumental in making all the necessary arrangements that resulted in a wonderful program. Thank you Maile. In celebrating the anniversary of the "right to vote" we are also cognizant of the need for stronger laws dealing with equal pay. Currently all states, with the exception of Mississippi, have equal pay laws. According to AAUW CEO, Kim Churches, real progress has been made lately in the fight for gender pay equity in terms of policy, most of it on a state and local level. However, the gender gap is still reported at about 82 cents on the dollar. The wage gap is a difficult problem and more research is needed to examine the systemic and structural impediments to women's economic security. The complexities call for careful scrutiny of past practices and customs that contribute to the gender pay gap. Fresno County Office of Education is in litigation defending what plaintiffs deem the very practices that contribute to the pay inequity. Perhaps a follow-up program on the Fresno litigation would be revealing as we advocate for equity for girls and women. Our next general meeting will be at the Ice House Theater as we enjoy "Beehive" with Susan Mathews as narrator. The musical celebrating the 60's will remind us that we really have come a long way. We look forward to seeing you on SUNDAY February 16, at 1:30.
