#### AAUW Celebrates Centennial of Women's Right to Vote!

This year marks the centennial of women's right to vote in the U.S., and A.A.U.W. kicked it off in style on January 21 with a joint commemoration with the League of Women Voters of Tulare County, at the Marriott Hotel. The festivities opened with mock Suffragists, all in period white with purple sashes and placards in hand, marching in while chanting their demands for democratic equality—just as they did a hundred years ago in front of the Wilson White House and across the nation. Keynote speaker Angelica Shirley Carpenter brought that history alive for us through the story in her latest book, "Born Criminal: Matilda Joslyn Gage, Radical Suffragist"—about one of the crucial, but lesserknown, leaders of the movement. Carpenter's well researched slides helped us imagine the times. With a hundred in attendance, the celebration was as lively as it was memorable.

Let's all be inspired by Carpenter's tales of how hard it was for women to earn suffrage: Be sure to vote in California's early Primary, March 3!"
